





- Did you consider any other subject when you applied?
- Why did you go into Medicine?
- What is a typical day for a doctor?
- Is there lots of homework in medical school?
- Is it better to go to an integrated or traditionally structure medical school?

- How much work experience do I need?
- Is it better to have 3 or 4 A-Levels?
- What GCSEs do you like?
- What "extra reading" should I do?
- Should I be doing volunteering as well?
- Can I get in with this UKCAT score?
- What do they ask in interview?
- What is the BMAT? And how should I prepare for it?
- What should I write in my personal statement?
- What are the lowest grades I could have and still get into Medicine?
